On Monday evening, Haddon Township residents, as well as residents from surrounding communities, came out to the Township's new Historic and Environmental Center located on E. Ormond Avenue to view *FRESH*. *FRESH* "celebrates the farmers, thinkers and business people across America who are re-inventing our food system." The film discusses the transformation of our agriculture into an industrial model, and confronts the consequences: food contamination, environmental pollution, depletion of natural resources, and morbid obesity. Forging healthier, sustainable alternatives, the film offers a practical vision for the future of our food and our planet. The viewing of *FRESH*, was presented by the Township's Sustainable Jersey Green Team.
