General Requirements for Street Trees

Single Stem Treeform: no branching in lower four feet at time of planting; for trees 2.0" cal and larger, no branching in lower 6 feet at time of planting.

Lower branches pruned to provide seven foot (7') pedestrian clearance above sidewalk.

Lower branches pruned to provide visual clearance at intersections.

Healthy, disease free.

Trees provided by nurseries for HTSTC shall meet American Nursery Standards, and have a well formed and uniform crown.

Use columnar types only where buildings are closer than 15' to the tree trunk.

Plantings along streets: Use only trees from the Street Trees list above, unless otherwise approved in writing by HT STC; no shrubs.
