

**MINUTES OF THE
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HADDON
SEPTEMBER 24, 2019
7:00PM**

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Randall W. Teague called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

FLAG SALUTE: Mayor Teague led in the salute to the flag.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Teague read the following statement, "Chapter 231, Public Law 1975 requires that adequate notice of this meeting be provided. Notices of this meeting have been transmitted to the Courier Post and Retrospect Newspapers and posted on the bulletin boards in the municipal building."

ROLL CALL: Jenai Johnson, Municipal Clerk, called the roll which resulted in the following members present: Mayor Randall W. Teague; Commissioner Ryan Linhart; Commissioner James Mulroy. Also present were Gregory Fusco, Municipal Engineer, and Eric Riso, Municipal Solicitor. Mayor Teague noted that there were several dignitaries in attendance including Mayor Pennock of Audubon Park; Councilwoman Jones and Depasquale, also of Audubon Park; Dawn Pennock, Clerk of Audubon Park and representatives and the Chief of Collingwood.

PRESENTATION OF COMMENDATION OF OFFICER WILLIAM MOORE AND OFFICER KENNETH JACOBY III: Commissioner Mulroy stated that he wished to first express all of his gratitude to the first responders and noted that the events of 9/11 were an epic example of the services they provide, with the first responders still experiencing continued suffering for their efforts on that day. Commissioner Mulroy stated that first responders only receive their due recognition when their heroic efforts are noticed, but suggested that appreciation to these individuals be given each and every day. Commissioner Mulroy stated that commendations were being presented to Kenneth Jacob of Collingswood and William Moore of Haddon Township. Commissioner Mulroy asked the officers to step forward and read the commendation being presented to them for saving an individual from drowning in Cooper River. Commissioner Mulroy emphasized that the heroic action saved a life. The Mayor and Commissioners presented each officer with the commendation and the audience applauded.

Ayes: Mayor Teague; Commissioner Linhart; Commissioner Mulroy.

SWEARING IN OF OFFICER FALKENBERG BY COMMISSIONER JAMES MULROY- Commissioner Mulroy stated that he was pleased to bring aboard Officer Falkenberg to the Haddon Township Police Department. Commissioner Mulroy stated that Officer Falkenberg had served in the position of a Class II officer in Mt. Ephraim and North Wildwood and would be an asset to the community. Commissioner Mulroy invited Officer Falkenberg and his family to step forward for the administration of the oath of office. Commissioner Mulroy swore in Officer Falkenberg while his parents stood by and held the bible. Upon the completion of the oath, the audience applauded and Mayor Teague excused those in attendance for the police ceremonial items on the agenda.

NOTICE OF RETIREMENT OF MICHAEL DEPALMA, CONSTRUCTION OFFICIAL, BUILDING INSPECTOR/SUBCODE AND PLUMBING INSPECTOR/SUBCODE-Commissioner Mulroy reported that he had received a letter from Michael DePalma notifying the Township of his retirement effective December 31, 2019. Councilman Mulroy stated that he would have the position posted for replacement and he was hopeful to have the position filled and appointed at the November Commissioner meeting. There were no objections to this action.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Commissioner Mulroy motioned to open the floor the public for comment, seconded by Commissioner Linhart and hearing none opposed, the floor was opened.

Gwen Baile, 24 Hampton Road- Mrs. Baile stated that she was again requesting that the length of the contract for yard waste be extended for composting Mayor Teague stated that the Township would need to wait until the expiration of the current contract to make any changes. Mayor Teague also noted that the Township was picking up yard waste after October 15th.

Renee Papaneri, 210 W. Crystal Lake- Inquiry was made regarding the status of the TNR program that was proposed. Mayor Teague advised that it was still under consideration and research completed, with the expectation that an ordinance could be introduced at the Commissioner Meeting in October.

Mitch Selbi, 100 White Horse Pike, Oaklyn- Mr. Selbi stated that trails of trash from the collectors were scattered down the street, and trash receptacles were being destroyed and damaged by the collector.

Mayor Teague stated that the Township did receive trash collection complaints from time to time, and they are addressed as they are received. Mayor Teague stated that the complaint would be forwarded to the contractor to remedy.

Seeing no further individuals in attendance wishing to speak, Commissioner Mulroy motioned to close the floor, seconded by Commissioner Linhart and hearing none opposed, motion as carried.

Commissioner Mulroy motioned to adjourn at 7:32PM, seconded by Commissioner Linhart, and hearing none opposed, meeting was adjourned.


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
