COMMUNICATIONS

PUBLIC COMMENT

There being no further business on the agenda, Commissioner Mulroy made a motion to open the meeting for public comment, seconded by Commissioner Linhart, with all members affirmatively concurring:

Cynthia Donegan, 111 Cornwall Drive – Ms. Donegan came to the meeting this evening to ask about Cornwall Drive and when it would be repaved. The mayor explained to Ms. Donegan that the plan is to put Cornwall and other roads out to bid. He further reported that he believes there was a large sewer pipe replaced around 25 years ago and bad backfill was used causing the issue. The old way was to purchase asphalt from an asphalt company and then have DPW overlay the streets. Mayor Teague stated that the Township has the engineer go out and identify the worse streets each year and this costs the Township roughly \$1 million per year. He further advised that the Township has the entire street done including replacing water and sewer lines. The Township estimated Cornwall to cost around \$750,000.00 and it will be done in approximately 3 phases. He commented that there is tree & root infiltration into the Street and the Township works with the Shade Tree with those issues. Replace all curbs and driveway aprons. Mayor Teague advised the residents would have a lot of inconveniences during the reconstruction.

Debra Bonacci, 140 Cornwall Drive – Ms. Bonacci asked for the estimated timeline for the three phases. Mayor Teague responded that it depends but it could take a couple years. He advised the resident that asphalt is not being made at this time. The Township is doing a \$21,000 repair to a really bad area on that street. Ms. Bonacci asked if the repair to the really bad area will happen prior to summer. Mayor Teague explained the process the Township goes through in order to repave a street: the Specifications for the bid process should be ready next month. The Township goes out to bid and the bidders have 30-45 days to complete the road. The Township takes the lowest bidder. He addresses the other issues that the Township may be faced with, such as Covid issues, employee issues and product issues. Ms. Bonacci asked the method by which the Township keeps in touch. Mayor Teague responded that he has been getting a lot of different emails from different people and it would be better if the Cornwall residents could create one email for all of them so the Township can keep them up-to-date.

Elizabeth Ackroyd, 136 Cornwall Drive – Ms. Ackroyd thanked the Mayor & Commissioners for being proactive and looking into the issue with Cornwall Drive. Mayor Teague said we have to correct mistakes from the past. That's just how it is.

Joseph Py, 15 Chestnut Street – Mr. Py came to the meeting this evening to address the parking of the Bricco customers. He wanted to know if the Township can make Chestnut a one-way street going away from Haddon Avenue. Mayor Teague pointed out several issues with making Chestnut one way, such as there are three main thoroughfares, inhibiting emergency vehicles, which includes police, fire and ambulance and the fact that Cuthbert will end up more jammed than it already is at this time. Mayor Teague asked if a police presence would help and Mr. Py said it would be great. He feels that the issues get addressed by the police making customers move their vehicles but not giving them tickets. Mayor Teague responded that he would have the police check into this and monitor the situation. Mr. Py went on to say that Bricco has tables and chairs all over the sidewalk. He has a neighbor that is disabled and blind and she tells him all the time about the sidewalk being blocked. Mayor Teague explained to Mr. Py that during Covid we encouraged our businesses to be outside but that is no longer the case, and there should always be a path for pedestrians.

There being no further public comments, Commissioner Mulroy moved to close the meeting for public comment, seconded by Commissioner Linhart, with all members voting in the affirmative.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to discuss, Commissioner Mulroy moved, seconded by Commissioner Linhart that the meeting be adjourned at 7:19 PM, with all members voting in the affirmative.
